On this 17th day of February A.D. 1873, personally appeared before me an associate Judge of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County and State aforesaid, Gideon Moser, aged thirty five years, a resident of Coaldale, County and State aforesaid, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Gideon Moser, who enlisted in the service of the United States at March Bluffs, on the 25th day of June, A.D. 1861, as a Private in Company "E" Commanded by Capt. Jaes D. Arner, in the 28th Regiment of Penn^a. Vols. in the war of 1861, and was honorably discharged on the 26th day of December, A.D. 1863, and reenlisted on the 24th day of December, A.D. 1863, a Corporal in Company "E" Commanded by Lieut. W^m. W. Linton of Co "16" in the 28th Regt. Penn^a. Vols. and was honorably discharged on the 18th day of July, A.D. 1865. That while in the service as aforesaid, and in the line of his duty, he received the following wound. At the Battle of Ringgold, Georgia, on or about the 27th day of November, A.D. 1863, he received a gun shot wound in the head, and the ball has not been extracted, which impaired his hearing, and incapacitated him for the

duty, and was sent to Hospital at Chattanooga, Tennessee, and from thence to his Regiment. Said wound has since impaired his hearing still more, and is nearly totally disabled for performing manual labor, and has resided in Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania, since leaving the service, and was an engineer when he entered the said service.

He hereby appoints Leptun Conrad of Tamapa, Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania his attorney, to prosecute his claim for pension.

Gun shot wound in forehead immediately above right eye. Loss of hearing in both ears, total loss in the left ear: not able to hear tick of watch in either ear when held close to head. Hearing not so bad when discharged from the army but growing worse since, and is now very bad. The aperture of entrance of ball is above right eye none of exit ball lodged in brain. Hole in forehead large enough

to lay in a Mini ball
NB. He is an Engineer by trade & is compelled to quit the profession on account of loss of hearing

In this
claim the question is, not
whether the claimant was
wounded in the service, nor
whether the present disabil-
ity is correctly stated, but
as to the connection of the
two. If the wound is
correctly described in the 1861
report, it is extremely unprob-
able that it caused the exist-
ing deafness. The precise
extent of injury inflicted by
the ball cannot, probably,
be now determined from
examination. The only means
of connecting the present dis-
ability with the service
would appear to be satis-
factory proof that it
Over-

listed at the time of dis-
charge. In the absence
of such proof the claim
must be rejected.
