I am acquainted with the said applicant and was well and intimately acquainted with her said deceased son Aaron Moser, for a period of from two to three years

prior to his enlistment in the U.S. Service in 1861. He and I were in the employ of Fellows & Vanham in what was then called Ashton and called Lansford in Carbon Co. Pa. from about April 1859 to Oct. 1860. I was Clerk in store and he, Aaron, driving team delivering goods &c. and we both lodged in the store together. Aaron was a faithful, industrious young man about 18 or 19 years of age and of good steady habits and in every respect kind and devoted to his parents words and commandments which fact I know from my intimate association with him at the time and at the time, namely he boarded at his home with his parents and took up his days except what he required for his own use in clothing in furnishing a maintenance for his mother and the other members of her family. He furnished clothing for his mother and various kinds of provisions for the family by purchasing them out of the said store and paying for the same by his labor for the said firm. It has been so long that I cannot now distinguish any particular article but well recollect that his purchases for the family maintenance was very general and of every day or nearly every day occurrence. This said firm has not been in existence for a long time since, 18 years or more.

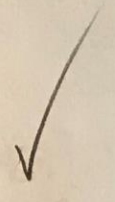
