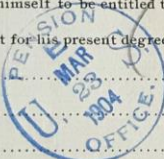

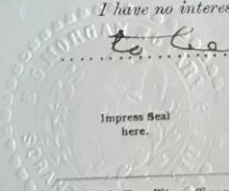

In response to your inquiry of the nineteenth instant, received the twenty-first, relative to the pension case, certificate numbered 130,137, of Gideon Moser, whose address is Scranton, Pennsylvania, and who served in Company E, Twenty-eighth Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry, I have the honor to advise you that on the seventeenth instant the claimant was called upon to furnish medical testimony showing the existing degree of deafness and the extent to which he is otherwise disabled by gunshot wound of head, for use in his claim for increase of pension under the general law.

Personally appeared before me the undersigned duly authorized to administer oaths within and for the County of Lackawanna and State of Pennsylvania, Dr. Herman Bessey, age forty-five years, who is personally known to me as a reputable and practicing physician of the City of Scranton, Lackawanna County, Pennsylvania, whom I know has been a physician in this City for the past eleven years; who being duly sworn according to law says that he has examined Gidfon Moser who is now a pensioner under pension certificate No. 130137;

Scranton, Pa. Mar. 26, 1908,

This is to certify that I have this day and date examined Gidfon Moser, of 1402 Lafayette St., Scranton, Pa. He was a soldier of the Civil War; a member of Co., E, 28th Reg., Pa., Inf. Vol. Upon examination I find that Mr. Moser is totally deaf in his left ear and cannot hear out of his right ear without an ear trumpet. There is on the right temple about one and one-half inches above the right eye evidence of a gun shot wound. The claimant alleges that he received the wound at Ringold, Georgia on the 27th day of Nov., 1863. The bullet was never extracted, since the bullet wound, deafness began and has gradually increased so that he is now practically deaf. He also suffers from vertigo, at times he reels, and staggers like a drunken man and frequently falls to the payment. He also suffers from Rheumatism of the shoulders and lower limbs, there is crepitus and limitation of motion over the right shoulder joint is equal to one half. Claimant has not been able to do any work since the 15th day of February, 1908. His general nutrition is poor. His muscles are soft and flabby; his skin dry and harsh, his hands show no evidence of manual labor.

By reason of the above disabilities the claimant is total disabled to earn his living by manual labor. He further says that he has no interest in the prosecution of this claim.

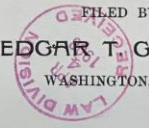

Dear sir,

The claim of Eideon Moser for an increase of pension has been returned as unsatisfactory because of statements regarding some ailments not traceable directly to his wound. This, however did not refer to his deafness.

This claim is made on the ground that he is now receiving \$27 per mo. which is the amt. received for partial deafness, while to all practical purposes he is totally deaf, along whatever line you may choose to list him, and he believes he should be so rated, and receive the \$13 per mo. increase.

Many practising physicians who have examined him positively assert that the deafness which now renders him incompetent to enter any employment by which he can earn a livelihood is caused by the gunshot wound he received in the battle of Ringgold, Ga., Nov. 27, '61.

The ball entered his head a little above the right temple. Spent force failing to carry it through the head, it was embedded

somewhere inside the skull, where it still remains. He suffers much from pain in the head, and is often overcome by dizziness. As the pain in head is almost incessant in a greater or less degree, it presumably is caused by gunshot wound, Doctors say it is. It does not know.

He is a total abstainer from intoxicants and tobacco.

Fifteen months ago, his employers for whom he had worked 26 years, thought the danger too great to himself and others, because of his deafness, to permit him longer to continue in their employ. Plenty of work he could do, but alas! he can not hear, and is turned away.

Our income is meagre. Nevertheless we are not begging, only asking for that which is given in exchange for that which deprives him not only of the ability of earning an independent living, but of social enjoyment. He is, as it were, socially ostracised. He can see, but not hear. This was painfully illustrated by yesterday, when with other veterans he was detailed to visit the schools of this city, as is customary at this season. He went as a living example of the sad effects of the Civil War. He appeared like one dumb. When a joke was made, he was unmoved, not having heard a sound. But sat, with only his own sad thoughts for company.

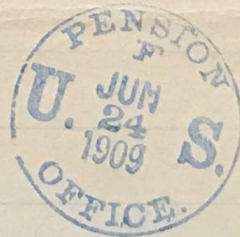

ON THIS 22nd day of June, A. D. one thousand nin hundred and nine, personally appeared before me, a Notary Public within and for the County and State aforesaid, Gideon Mason, aged 70 years, a resident of Scranton, County of Lackawanna State of Pennsylvania, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is a pensioner of the United States, enrolled at the Philadelphia Pension Agency at the rate of 27.00 dollars per month, under Certificate No. 130,137, by reason of disability from gun (Here name the disability or disabilities for which now pensioned.) shot wound of the head and resulting deafness

incurred in the Military service of the United States, while serving as a Captain, (Military or Naval.) Co. E, and 28th Regt. of Pa. Vol. Infantry, and regiment, if in the Army; or rating and name of vessel, if in the Navy.)

That he believes himself to be entitled to an increase of pension on account of gun-shot wound of the head and resulting deafness.

(Here state reasons for applying for increase. If on account of increase in the disability for which already pensioned, the fact should be stated, and the manner and extent of the progression of the disability described. If on account of disease resulting from the disability for which pensioned, the names of the disease should be stated.)

I was severely wounded in the Battle of Ringgold, Ga. on the 27th of Aug, 1864. The ball entered my head one half inch above the right eye and was never extracted after repeated efforts of probing for it by the army surgeons. My left ear is permanently deaf, and I can only hear out of my right ear by means of an ear-trumpet if the party talks loud. I have not done any work for nearly 18 months. 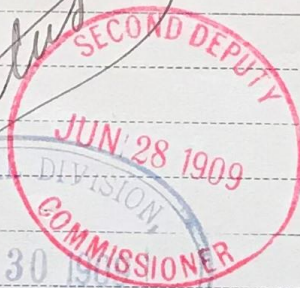
