George Philip Wertman settled in 1749 in Lynn Township, present-day Lehigh County, Pennsylvania. A number of members of this family moved to the "great north woods," or what is today called the Rapids, Lockport, New York. So like our ancestors before us, the Wertman Reunion will move to Lockport. You, your relatives and friends are most cordially invited to attend the annual reunion of the Wertman family.

Details follow, but here is a summary of planned events. On Friday, 15 August, there will be a Family Researcher's Meeting. Wertman Family Association Business Meeting

Ashland, Ashland Co., OH, 17 August 2002

Call to Order and Welcome: After a picnic at Brookside Park West, Wertman Family Association (WFA) President Russell Dannecker called the meeting to order at 1:25 p.m. There were 53 individuals present. The adults in attendance introduced themselves, told where they live and said how they were connected to the Wertman family. Russ also introduced WFA officers and committee members.

Attendance Awards: Russ presented four awards: Phyllis Gabel, CA, who came the longest distance, received a travel alarm clock; Rosa Wertman Strickling, age 92, the most senior lady, received a silver brooch; Herb Dannecker, born April 1927, the most senior gentleman, received a key ring and flag pin; and Jenny Ewing accepted a stuffed teddy bear on behalf of her son, Spencer Ewing, age 4 months, the youngest in attendance.

Secretary's Report and Newsletter: Shirley Daniels summarized the minutes from the 2001 meeting. Members moved, seconded and voted to accept the minutes. Shirley reported that the November 2001 and June 2002 newsletters were mailed to those without e-mail or who had requested postal copies. The 75-name mailing list also includes genealogical and historical societies and libraries. Shirley sends Tom Young a newsletter file in html to be linked to the WFA web page at http://www.freepages.genealogy.rootsweb.com /~wertman. Shirley mailed news releases announcing this year's reunion to genealogical and historical societies and libraries as well as newspapers in Ashland OH, Lockport NY, and Allentown PA.

Treasurer's Report: Shirley Wertman reported a balance of \$1,233.34 in treasury. the The balance after last year's reunion was \$1,388. She reimbursed Shirley Daniels for printing and mailing two isof sues the



newsletter and mailing news releases for this year's reunion. Reunion 2002 expenses were \$1,263.56 and reunion receipts were \$1,122.50. She has received \$180 in '02-03 dues. Dues of \$20 per family were due July 1. Members moved, seconded and voted to accept the treasurer's report.

Historical Acceptance Committee (HAC)/Web Site Report: HAC Chair/Webmaster Tom Young has appointed Linda Meyers of Byron, IL, to fill the vacancy on the HAC after Richard Hull's death. The web site is still available to us with no maintenance or other charges. Its purpose is to draw people to contact us, and Tom and Russ assist those who ask for help. Our web page is usually first in search engine hit lists for Wertman. Four generations are posted and Tom will be adding dates and other data. Tom mentioned that it was appropriate to hold this reunion in Ohio because Solomon came to Ohio in 1831 and two sons of Simon, Jacob and John, came in 1837. Members moved, seconded and voted to approve Tom's report.

Reunion Committee Report: 2002 Chair Frank Strickling introduced committee members Jenny Ewing, Nancy Johnson, Shirley Null, Judy and Rosa Strickling and Mary Lou Wertman. Judy gave each family a souvenir bag containing Ohio buckeyes; a balloon to remind us that Ashland was once the balloon capital of the world; sweetpea seeds from Rosa Wertman Strickling's garden; Ashland maple syrup candy (Ohio is the third largest maple syrup producer in the United States); and a cloth apple representing early pioneer John Chapman (Johnny Appleseed), who spent 25 years establishing apple nurseries around Ashland County. Shirley Null presented gifts to Judy Strickling in recognition of her work on the

committee and her special touches that helped to make this reunion particularly welcoming, such as the wildflowers on the picnic tables, the souvenir bags and the brochure/map packets received at check-in by those staying at the reunion hotel. Russ Dannecker proposed that the 2003 WFA reunion be held in Lockport, NY, 15-17 August. Members moved, seconded and voted to approve the Lockport location and dates.

Appointments by the Chair: Russ has appointed Ed Wertman, Macungie, PA, as Vice President until next year's election of officers. Russ paid tribute to former WFA Vice President Richard Hull, who passed away this year, and all observed a moment of silence in memory of Richard. Members of the nominating committee, to report at least 60 days before the 2003 reunion, are Ken Cool, Phyllis Gabel and Phyllis Hull. David Wertman (NJ; not at this year's meeting) has agreed to chair the 2003 Reunion Committee.

New Business: Hal Merz knows a German researcher who could do some work for us. Tom will speak with her and make a proposal to the Board.

Adjournment/Auction: The meeting adjourned at 2:20 p.m., after which the auction was held with proceeds going to the WFA treasury. The winning bids were: \$11 by Shirley Wertman for a sun-tea maker full of goodies, donated by Ruth Ann Feil; \$35 by Jan Dannecker for a table runner, quilted by Mary Ellen Wagner; \$25 by Lynn Dashner for a "Honey Bee" pillow, made by Mary Ellen Wagner; and \$25 by Lynn Dashner for a patriotic gift basket containing an Uncle Sam nutcracker, napkins, notepaper and more, donated by Ruth Ann Feil. Scarves handcrafted by Bernadine Sterner were available for a \$20 donation. **On Sunday, 18 August,** members car-pooled in six vehicles to search for Wertman family tombstones in the Ohl and Ashland City cemeteries, have lunch at Frank and Judy Strickling's, and tour the Ashland County Historical Society.

Wertman Family Association Researchers Meeting

Ashland, Ashland County, Ohio 16 August 2002

Welcome: At 9:15 a.m., Russell Dannecker, President of the Wertman Family Association (WFA), called to order the third annual meeting of Wertman researchers, held at Peace Lutheran Church, Ashland, Ohio, 16 August 2002. Russ introduced and thanked Frank Strickling, chair of the reunion committee, and other members of the committee: Jenny Ewing, Nancy Johnson, Shirley Null, Judy Strickling, Rosa Strickling and Mary Lou Wertman, and welcomed those attending. After noting two significant events for the WFA this vear - the September 11 tragedy and the death of Richard Hull — Russ turned over the meeting to Tom Young, Webmaster and Historical Acceptance Committee (HAC) Chair, who was in charge of the day's presentations.

HAC Report: Tom Young began with a tribute to Richard Hull, WFA Vice President and HAC member, who died 30 April 2002. Richard was a thoughtful, tireless and thorough researcher and WFA members mourn his loss. Tom has appointed Linda Meyers of Byron, IL, to fill the vacancy on the HAC. Other committee members are Ken Cool, Dora Kamalu, Ed Sterrett, and Esther Walton. Linda and Dora were unable to attend this year's meeting.

Web Site Report: The web site at *http://www.freepages.genealogy.rootsweb.com/* ~*wertman* is still available to us at no charge and Tom keeps the page design simple. We do not want the data to be easily downloaded since our goal is for people to contact us, hopefully providing new information and bringing to light private documents. Tom and Russ help those who ask, sending them instructions on how to proceed and, if their placement cannot be determined, providing information on probable ancestors. Through the web site, we have made contact with probably 30 individuals within the last year. Tom also mentioned that our web page is usually listed first in search engine hits on the surname Wertman.

Data Base Report: Tom has uploaded names only of four generations; dates and places will be in the next entry, followed by notes. Tom noted that we have no primary documentation for the five sons of George Philip Wertman (GPI); we have tombstones or burial records for only three of the sons (GPII, Simon and Martin); we have guessed

at the birth order on many descendants; and we are looking for proof of many items.

Future Directions, Genetic Genealogy: Tom explained some basics, concerns, costs and limits of DNA analysis for genealogical use. When the technology becomes more standardized, more markers are tested, and prices come down, we may want to consider using this tool. We would have to design the project with a set goal, get enough Wertman males to participate, and carefully select a lab. More information about the technology and surname projects can be found on the DNA portal of Rootsweb.

Lunch: Members enjoyed a full lunch buffet at Peace Lutheran Church.

Ohio Wertman Civil War Soldiers: Russ Dannecker presented an overview of the Civil War and described soldiers' camp life. Before the Civil War. in "these" United States. the focus was on states. After the Civil War, in "the" United States. the focus was on the country. There were 384 battles, and their locations on a map show that the North burned the "bread basket" of the Shenandoah Valley, wanted to capture the Mississippi River to split the Confederacy, wanted to capture the CSA Capitol, Richmond, and wanted to blockade and strangle the South. Soldiers did not fight in winter because roads were impassable. Of 300,000 soldiers from Ohio, 35,475 died during the war, and of those, 23,887 died of disease. Three Ohio Wertmans in the Civil War were Reuben, George W. and Norman. Reuben, age 43, enrolled as a Private in Company F, 72nd Regiment, Ohio Infantry. He was sent home with typhoid fever and chronic diarrhea after the Battle of Shiloh and died in Medina Co., OH, 28 May 1862. George W., age 19, enrolled as a Private in Company F, 120th Regiment, Ohio Infantry. His regiment participated in the Battle of Chickasaw Bluffs and the Expedition against Arkansas Point. He died 9 May 1863 at Van Buren Hospital, Millikens Bend, LA. Norman, age 18, enrolled as a Private in Company A, 196th Regiment, Ohio Infantry. He was mustered in at Wooster. OH. 15 Mar 1865 and mustered out in Baltimore, MD, 11 Sep 1865. He died 25 Sep 1920 at his farm in Cowley Co., KS.

John and Jacob Wertman of Ashland: Tom Young outlined data on John and Jacob Wertman, sons of Simon Wertman and Barbara Stebleton, who moved to Ohio in the 1830s. The census shows them in Albany Twp., Berks Co., PA, in 1790 and 1800; in Bloom Twp., Columbia Co., PA, in 1810, '20 and '30; and in Richland Co., OH, in 1840. John's birth date, calculated from his tombstone, was 7 Dec 1784 (probably Berks Co., PA) and he died 9 Sep 1845. He married Anna Maria (possibly Reichelderfer) born 8 Apr 1784 and died 5 Jan 1858. Jacob's birth date in the baptismal records of New Bethel Church, Berks Co., was 2 May 1785 although his birth date calculated from his tombstone was 26 Feb 1786. He died 26 Nov 1863. His wife, Maria Magdalena Reichelderfer, was born 6 Apr 1789 and died 11 Jul 1865. John, Anna Maria, Jacob and Maria Magdalena were buried in the Ashland (OH) City Cemetery.

Solomon Wertman of Ashland: HAC member Ken Cool presented information on Solomon Wertman, son of David Werthmann and Maria Catherina Hoppes/Happes, born 8 Mar 1809 in West Penn Twp., Schuylkill Co., PA. He moved to Richland Co., OH, in 1830 or 1831. He married Mary Jane Ohl and their children were David and Daniel. After Mary Jane's death (betw. 1834-1837; place of burial unknown), he married her sister, Rebecca (Apr 1837). They had four children: Lavina, Ely, Samuel and Kate. Solomon died 7 Sep 1894 and was buried in the Ohl Cemetery, Milton Twp., Ashland Co., OH.

George Wertman of Pickaway County, OH: WFA member Hal Merz discussed George Wertman, who came to Pickaway County, southcentral Ohio, in 1814 in a four-horse-drawn wagon with his step-father Andrew Hines and family. George was born in Union Co., PA, in 1805. He and his wife, Mary Susanna Leist, had two children, David (1828-1896) and John (1836-1924). His obituary says his father was John (perhaps Jacob or Johan Jacob). Which Jacob? Tom Young knows of seven Jacobs in four generations of Wertmans, plus five Jacobs born in the early 1800s that we have not yet connected to us.

Dinner and Evening Presentation: The afternoon meeting adjourned at 4 p.m. Peace Lutheran Church hosted the group for dinner at 6 p.m. At 7 p.m., Rita Bone Kopp, from the Ashland County Chapter of the Ohio Genealogical Society, spoke about Wertmans in Ashland. The county was formed in 1846 from Huron, Lorraine, Wayne and Richland counties. The Ohio Genealogical Society Library in Mansfield has an extensive collection of research materials; a branch is in the Ashland Public Library on South Main Street. A helpful book, free from *petro@auditor.state.oh.us* is "The Official Ohio Lands Book." The area where Solomon settled was primarily Mennonite when he

arrived, and his farm would have been heavy native forest. Settlers in Mifflin County probably came via Bells Trail, an old Indian Path, while those coming to northern Ohio probably used Lake Erie. Land was cheaper in Ohio and more plentiful, so families could settle together. Since Simon Wertman's farm in Bloom Township, PA, was involved in a dispute, there are estate records and "John, son of Simon," is documented in a deposition. Estate records in Ohio to 1851 were in the Common Pleas records.
