Identified in notes of Isabelle Stage where she describes the children of Jonathan Michael and Hannah. Makes the point that Jacob is brother to Barbara who married Lydia.s brother Daniel. For first time I learn that Lydia married Vogel, presumably as first husband and before the marriage to Schroeder/Schrader which all seems to date later. Later review of her papers by Doug Metz identifies his birthplace as in Shawnee.

WERTMAN LINES ARTICLE -- Jacob Vogel, 11th US Regular Infantry

In 2007 the United States Department of Veterans Affairs provided the Wertman Family Association a grave marker for Private Jacob Vogel from New York. In large part due to the efforts of Anita Reid, the city of Lockport, NY provided the money for the footings for the headstones for this veteran of the Civil War. He was wounded and suffered the rest of his life.

One warm July day I climbed to one of my favorite spots - Little Round Top at Gettysburg, PA. From the top you have a panoramic view of the entire battlefield. There are many monuments in view, but as you look west and across the valley you might notice a semi-circle of similar sized and shaped memorials. This position will later be described as the "crest of the rocky wooded hill." For years these stone markers were hidden in the woods (see picture below), but recently the National Park Service has endeavored to return the battlefield to the way it looked on July 1-3, 1863. So now the trees are gone and the monuments revealed.

These semi-circles of stones are the markers belonging to some of United State Army Regulars who fought at Gettysburg. The bronze plaque in the picture reads: ARMY OF THE POTOMAC. FIFTH CORPS, SECOND DIVISION SECOND BRIGADE, ELEVENTH U. S. INFANTRY, Six Companies, Major Delancey Floyd Jones Commanding.

The History reads: July 2 [1863]. Arrived in the morning with the Brigade and took position on the right of the Twelfth Corps. Afterwards moved to the left and at 5 PM. formed line on the right of Little Round Top and advanced across Plum Run and to the crest of the rocky wooded hill in front under a fire of

The Confederates having opened fire on the right flank and advancing through the Wheatfield in the rear the Regiment with the Brigade was withdrawn under a heavy fire of musketry and artillery and formed in line at the right of Little Round Top. July 3. Remained in same position. Present 25 Officers and 281 men. Casualties Killed 3 Officer and 18 Men; Wounded 7 Officers and 85; Men Missing 9 Men.</p> <p>One of the 85 men wounded has a Wertman connection. His name was Jacob Vogel. Shortly after returning from the war in 1865 he would marry Lydia A. Wertman.</p> <p>In the Official Records of the Civil War we find the following account of the battle written by Jacob Vogel's commanding officer. That report, written a few days after the battle, reads as follows: Numbers 215. Report of Major De Lancey Floyd-Jones, Eleventh U. S. Infantry. CAMP NEAR BERLIN, MD. July 16, 1863.</p> <p>CAPTAIN: In obedience to the circular from brigade headquarters, I have the honor to furnish in brief a report of the operations of the Eleventh U. S. Infantry at the battle of Gettysburg, on the 2nd instant. In company with the other battalions of the brigade, we moved about 5 p. m. from our resting place, nearly opposite the center of the army, to near the Sugar Loaf or Round Top Mountain, a point near the left of the line. Immediately upon reaching this, we were ordered to advance in line of battle, passing from the shelter of a wood across an open field, through which ran a heavy morass. [Plum Run, mentioned above] We advanced in good order, although exposed to a flank fire from the enemy, and halted immediately in front of a piece of woods [at the crest of the rocky wooded hill], where we lay some half hour or more. Our brigade then relieved some troops of the Second Corps, for which purpose we advanced into the woods, at the same time changing our direction by a wheel to the left. After firing a few rounds in the woods, it was discovered that the enemy was turning our right flank, and we were ordered to fall back, which was done in good order until we reached half way across the open field, when we became exposed to a cross-fire of the enemy, the effect of which was most deadly upon officers and men. Our loss up to this time had been comparatively slight, but in a few minutes we lost nearly half of the regiment, and that, too, without inflicting the slightest damage upon the enemy. We finally reached the wood, when we were enabled to reform and face the enemy. Our loss in this engagement was fearful. Out of 261 enlisted men and 25 officers, the regiment lost 106 enlisted men and 10 commissioned officers, among the latter some of our best officers.</p> <p>From this report we can conclude that in all likely hood Jacob Vogel was wounded about 6:00 PM on 2 July 1863 as his unit retreated.</p> <p>According to Jacob Vogel's military records that survive at the National Archives and Records Administration in Washington, DC he was born in Shawnee, New York. This farmer was 22 years old when he enlisted on 17 June 1862 in Company B of the 2nd Battalion of the 11th United State Infantry (Regular Army). He is described as having blue eyes, light colored hair, light</p>

Notice that on 19 August 1864 Jacob Vogel was captured. He was not alone. The Official Records of the Civil War contain two pieces of correspondence from Jacob Vogel's commanding officer, General Governor K. Warren. Note that they are both dated the day Jacob was captured and even time stamped.

HEADQUARTERS FIFTH ARMY CORPS,

August 19, 1864 - 6.50 p. m.

Major-General HUMPHREYS:

The enemy broke through the line I had just established between my position and that on the plank road, and moving rapidly on my right flank, compelled the whole of Crawford's and Ayres' divisions [Jacob Vogel's division] to fall back. A heavy fight took place, and the whole line has been regained, taking many prisoners. They are from Mahone's, Heth's, and Hoke's divisions. Our loss is heavy, being considerable in prisoners. I will report more definitely when I get returns.

General Crawford. Cutler's division will not be much reduced when we get it together. Ayres has lost very heavily and General Hayes [Jacob Vogel's brigade commander] is missing. We have possession of all ground fought over, numerous prisoners, and two stand of colors. I do not think it possible to establish the line across to-night as suggested in your dispatch. I have Willcox and White in good position to maintain my position. They have both been engaged. Potter's men did not get further than the Aiken house and I have stationed the there for to-night. We are well disposed as we can be against the enemy if he attack in the morning. The enemy everywhere fell back from our attack to-night in confusion, and if the troops had only held a little against the flank attack they could have stood it. If I could reoccupy the line of the picket which was broken to-day I would not think it advisable. We will try it in the morning if not attacked, and if we are we are just right now.

Number 146. Reports of Bvt. Brigadier General Frederick Winthrop, Fifth New York Veteran Infantry, commanding First Brigade, of operations August 18-21, October 8, and December 7-12.

HDQRS. FIRST BRIGADE, SECOND DIVISION, FIFTH CORPS,
August 22, 1864.

CAPTAIN: I have the honor to furnish the following report of the part taken by this brigade in the operations on the Weldon railroad, commencing on the 18th of august and ending on the 21st:

At daylight on the morning of the 18th of August the brigade-composed of the Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth, Fourteenth, and Seventeenth Regiments U. S. Infantry and the Fifth, One hundred and fortieth, and One hundred and fort-sixth Regiments New York State Volunteers, under the command of Brigadier-General Hayes-broke camp and moved off in a southwesterly direction toward the Weldon railroad, and moved off in a southwesterly direction toward the Weldon railroad, striking that road at the Yellow House, six miles from Petersburg, striking that road at the Yellow House, six miles from Petersburg, about 10 a. m. Up to this time the troops had met with very little opposition, excepting from a small force of the enemy's cavalry, which had been readily dispersed and driven back. On arriving opposite to the Black house the brigade deployed in two lines of battle across the railroad, with the Twelfth Infantry and portion of the One hundred and fortieth New York Volunteers thrown out as skirmishers. In this disposition we advanced slowly and steadily up the railroad for about three-fourths of a mile, under a heavy artillery fire, and most of the way through a dense undergrowth of pine and oaks, until the front line arrived within about thirty yards of the farther edge of the front line arrived within about thirty yards of the farther edge of the woods, beyond which, in Davis' corn-field, our skirmishers were actively engaged with those of the enemy. had already driven the enemy's skirmishers beyond the Davis house, and had compelled one of their batteries to retire front, and presently advanced out of the woods in front of the Davis house in two strong lines of battle, sweeping our skirmishers before them and striking our line in front and flank with such violence that, after considerable resistance, they were forced to retire to the rear edge of the woods, carrying with them the greater portion of their wounded. Here a new line was established and breast-works thrown up. In this position the command remained during the afternoon and night of the 18th.

On the morning of the 19th our dead and wounded were recovered. On the afternoon of the 19th the enemy attacked our lines in force, breaking through the troops of the division on our right, and rapidly enveloping the Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth, Fourteenth, and Seventeenth Infantry, which were posted in the front line of works on the right of the railroad. The enemy striking our rear so suddenly, many of the regiments, and especially the Twelfth and Fourteenth Infantry, were regiments, and especially the Twelfth and Fourteenth Infantry, were forced to fight their way through, losing by this means heavily in prisoners. I regret to say that Brigadier-General Hayes, U. S. Volunteers, and Lieutenant Brady, Fourteenth Infantry, his acting assistant adjutant-general, were captured at this time, while endeavoring to reach the position held by the Twelfth and Fourteenth Infantry. The remainder of the brigade, having received orders, fell back and formed, about 700 yards to the rear, under shelter of the artillery. The command of the brigade now devolved upon me.

Jacob Vogel remained in prison for seven months until paroled in March 1865. After his discharge he returned home from the war in June of 1865, and less than two months latter was married to Lydia Wertman. Their marriage (see wedding picture) lasted just over nine years. Jacob died in 1874. What was his cause of death? In her Declaration for Original Pension, Lydia Shrader, nee Wertman, states that "...as will show - his military career: severe wound in thigh and continuos results and effects, culminating in death."

Since his death Jacob Vogel grave did not indicate his service to his country. Now at last he is recognized for the service that eventually cost him his life.

Anna Wertman Davis refers in a 1914 letter to her mother being with Aunt Tillie. Since the other two girls in that family are accounted for, it seems likely that this Lydia was known as Tillie???

Obit in Lockport newspaper cites her as an out of town (Clarence, NY) attendee
