All the blanks in this form should be carefully filled and the requirements of the notes strictly observed.  
Declarations and other papers should be as legible and as clear in statement as possible.  
Where any evidence is already on file in any department of the Government, a definite description of and specific reference to it will render it available in any subsequent claim.  
The post-office address (naming street and number in all large cities) of the applicant, a lawyer, and witness, should be stated in or accompanying every application, and all evidence in each claim; and each change of residence of applicant should be stated.  
Pensions are, by law, exempted from any liability on account of the obligations of the pensioners, and no lien upon them can be recognized.  
All facts, testimony of which is required to establish a claim, must be proven by the affidavits of two or more credible witnesses unless other evidence is specified.  
The statements of claimants, unless duly corroborated, are not accepted as evidence.  
Testimony in support of allegations made in a declaration may be taken before any officer whose authority and signature are duly certified, and who shall disclaim any interest, direct or indirect, in the prosecution of the claim.  
With all claims for arrears, increases, or restoration to the rolls, the original pension certificate must be returned, or explanation of its absence must be given under oath.  
To facilitate the adjudication of claims, all the requisite evidence that is available should be forwarded with the application.

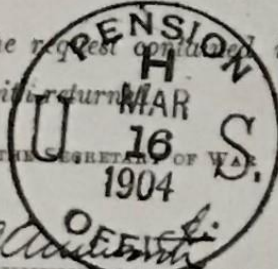

In the above-entitled claim for pension, the evidence indicated in paragraph *No. 3 and 4* should be furnished.

No. 1. The affidavit of a commissioned officer, or of the first sergeant, or of other enlisted men of the soldier's company, showing when, where, and under what circumstances he incurred

No. 2. The affidavit of the surgeon, assistant surgeon, or hospital steward of the soldier's regiment, showing treatment while in the service for

No. 3. A full history, medical as far as possible, of the soldier's physical condition from the time of his discharge to *death - September 19<sup>th</sup> 1871 - for fatal disability.*

The affidavit of each physician who attended the soldier should be furnished, stating when his personal knowledge of the case commenced, and the period over which it continued; the dates and duration of all treatment, and the nature of all disabilities from which the soldier suffered.

If the claimant is unable to furnish the testimony of any one or more of the physicians who attended the soldier, he should state under oath the reason for *h*. inability, the names of the physicians whose testimony can not be obtained, and the periods of time during which they treated him; and for every such period he should furnish the testimony of credible witnesses—employers, fellow-workmen, or neighbors—having sufficient knowledge of him to describe his physical condition while under their observation. The statements of the witnesses should be full and definite, setting forth the period during which the soldier was under their observation, how often they saw him, how he was affected from time to time, and how they were able to determine the nature of his disabilities.

No. 4. The affidavit of the attending physician, giving a full clinical history of the soldier's last illness, showing the duration thereof; the remote and immediate cause, as well as the date, of death; whether there were any complications or contributory causes, and, if so, their nature, and to what extent they were factors in the fatal result. Also, a certified copy of the public record of the soldier's death, if such record exists.

Witnesses must state their post-office addresses, ages, and means of knowledge of the facts to which they testify, and write their names immediately after their statements, leaving no blank space over their signatures; and it should appear in the jurats that they knew the contents of their affidavits, and that erasures or alterations, if any, were made before the oath was administered.

This circular should be returned with the evidence.

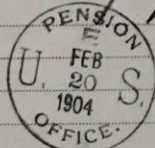
